March 16, 1960 - March 29, 2025

Clayton Weiss, age 65 of Omro, formerly of Berlin, passed away peacefully in his sleep on Saturday, March 29, 2025 in Berlin, surrounded with the love from his friends and family. Clay fought a long battle with heart and kidney disease.

He was born in Lake Bluff, Illinois on March 16, 1960. His parents were Ardis and Louis Weiss.

Clay was a 1979 Berlin High School graduate and worked in the maintenance department at Seneca Foods as well as for others in the cleaning business. He loved his tools and never compromised on getting the best tools for the job as he took immense pride in his work.

He also assisted every year with the “St. Joe’s Run”, “Race the Lake” and “Rethink Addiction” runs where he earned the “Best Volunteer of the Year” award in 2023.

Being proud of his Native American heritage, Clay exemplified courage, loyalty, hard-work and tenacity during his life.

Clay is survived by his sister, Cozette (Paul) Cismoski; brother, Cary (Sue) Weiss; nieces, Nicole Cismoski, Tara (Matt) Eichstead, Jenna (Adam) Hilgart; nephews, Brandon (Megan) Williams, Matt Arbogast; best friend, Gloria; other relatives and many friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Louis and Ardis Weiss; and brother, Chris.

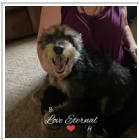
