David J Marvin, age 79 of Berlin, passed away Tuesday Morning October 12, 2021 at Juliette Manor in Berlin.

He was born November 3, 1941 in Oshkosh Wisconsin, son of Eugene and Sylvia (Marquardt) Marvin.

David was a 1960 Graduate of Berlin High School then served in the U S Army from 1963 thru 1969 in Co C 54th Engineer Battalion USA UAUR in Wildflecken Germany and was honorably discharged in 1969.

At the time of his enlistment in 1963, he was employed by Berlin Chapman Co. He was later an employee of Kalupa Construction Company and Midwestern Sport Togs.

In 1971 he served as a part-time radio operator for the Berlin Police Dept, and was a volunteer Fireman from 1970 thru 1977.

As a member of the VFW Wells-Krause Post #2925, he walked many miles carefully placing flags on the graves of veterans in area cemeteries for observance of Memorial Day.

He was an amazing baker, camp cook and enjoyed cooking for VFW events. Dave is survived by his wife of 34 yrs. 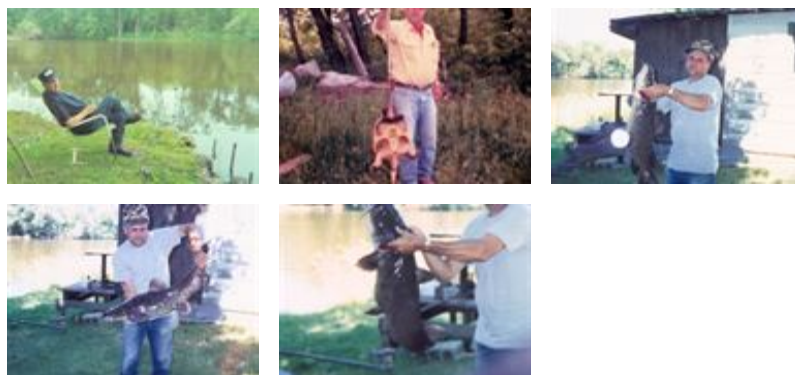

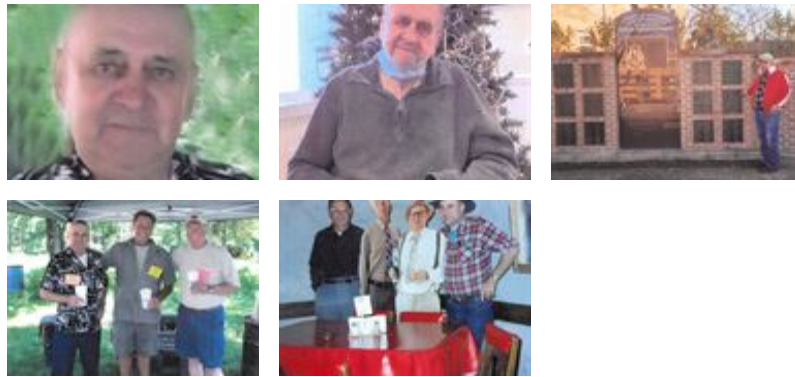
