He graduated from the Morton High School and Junior College of Cicero, Ill. He served his country in the U.S. Navy in WWII being in the American Theatre South Pacific, receiving the Good Conduct Medal and also served as a Navy Mail Clerk.

He married Elisabeth (Beth) (Druggish) in 1952 at Saint Michael's Catholic Church of Berlin and she preceded him in death on September 29, 1996. Earl then married Judith A. (Markofski) Klemp on November 7, 1998 in Seymour, Wi.

He was a self-employed, Farmer and was an Auctioneer with John Steeps and a retired agent for the Farm Bureau Insurance Co., he loved flying and was a licensed pilot, also played Clarinet, Sax and Trumpet in the VFW band of Oshkosh, Rainbow Valley Band and Bartow Adult Concert Band of Fort Meade, Florida, where he and Judy spent their winters. He also served on the Green Lake County Board and the Tri-County Commission on aging for many years.

He is survived by his beloved wife Judy, two daughters, Patricia Sylvia Pinkall-Pollei of Edgerton, WI and Pamela Gertrude Pinkall of Memphis, TN, grandson, Richard Earl Pinkall-Pollei (fiancée, Angela Ghaly) of Madison, also Judy's children, Darrell, David, Debra, Doug and Deanna and grandchildren and great grandchildren, also other relatives and friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents, first wife, Elisabeth (Beth) and a brother, Eugene.
