John "Jack" T. Kasubaski, age 76 of Berlin, passed away on Saturday, August 9, 2025, At ThedaCare-Neenah.

Jack was born April 16, 1949, at Berlin Memorial Hospital, the son of Benjamin and Elizabeth (Mahar) Kasabaski. He always commented that he was the first of eleven children in his family to be born in a hospital.

On September 3, 1994, he married Kathryn "Kathy" Briski in Berlin in the Nathan Strong Park Gazebo. Jack and Kathy would often visit the gazebo on their wedding anniversary. They moved to Berlin in 1997.

Jack worked for his dad on the farm near Neshkoro, then the Ladder factory in Neshkoro and then later, he worked for the Berlin Foundry, retiring there in 2014 after 41 years

He loved sports. He played and also managed for Neshkoro softball teams for over 30 years. He was a very good outfielder, "That guy could run!", and he was excellent with stats. He could remember a score from a league or tournament game that he played in 50 years ago. He played with several nephews on these teams, which he truly enjoyed.

Jack was also an avid bowler, sometimes bowling four nights a week! He also

loved to deer and turkey hunt on the family farm and spending time with his family at the hunting shack. Many card games were played there along with lots of food, “Who wants another burger?” could always be heard. Jack was also a good joke and storyteller, how he could remember all of those jokes?

He also enjoyed a good round of golf, having been a member of the Waushara Country Club.

Jack loved watching sports on TV, Brewers, Packers, high school sports, especially tournaments, he would even adjust his work schedule to enjoy the boys and girls’ tournaments in March.

Jack and Kathy loved to travel. Door County and the Minocqua area were just 2 of their favorite destinations. Through the years, their “road trips” took them to 33 states.

He is survived by his wife of 30 years, Kathy; three sons, Mark (fiancé Lisa) Kasubaski, Matt (Katie) Kasubaski, Phillip (Indri) Kasubaski; grandchildren, Stephanie, Micaela, Sophia, Evan, Kyle, Khaya, and great-grandchildren. A brother, Bob (Marie) Kasubaski, sister, Jane (Guy) Richard, sisters-in-law, Dorothy Kasubaski, Beverly Kasubaski, and Jane Kasubaski; brother-in-law, Ron (Gloria) Briski; nieces, nephews, other relatives, and many friends.

I guess you missed the deer as you hunted with Grandpa's 300 savage. When you emptied the gun of shells, the deer then stopped and stood looking at you. I still hear your voice yelling at that deer! Those FUN times our families hunted together where times I will always cherish. I always enjoyed watching you and my brothers play mens softball in Neshkoro against the many surrounding town teams. I can still see everyone playing as Uncle Dale would pitch bare-handed. I remember you were managing the team and at times you would put yourself in the game to pinch hit. You would get a hit that allowed Neshkoro to score which then created a successful win! These are all GREAT memories. You may be gone, but will never be forgotten Uncle Jack!
