Kenneth J. Thomas, age 86 of Berlin, passed away peacefully with family by his side on Tuesday, April 21, 2015 at the Theda- Clark Medical Center in Neenah, Wisconsin.

He was born on April 9, 1929, the son of the late Benjamin and Leocadia (Ceman) Thomas on the family farm in the Town of Aurora, Berlin.

Ken went to school one mile from home at the old Spoehr schoolhouse. He then began working with his father on the family farm. He was drafted into the army in 1952 whereby he fought in the Korean War and returned home in 1954.

He met the love of his life, Gretchen M. Viertel and they were married September 4, 1954 at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Berlin. They purchased the family farm from his parents and raised their five children there. They enjoyed 60 wonderful years together.

Ken also worked in various jobs including Borden Dairy, and finally with the Wisconsin Bell Telephone Company until his retirement in 1992. Ken continued to farm until retiring from farming as well, but he always enjoyed a large garden from which they canned bountiful produce (tomatoes, sweet corn and other vegetables). Other interests Ken had were playing cribbage, sheepshead, and poker with family and friends and picking up and cracking out hickory nuts with his wife. He was a very devoted husband, father and grandfather.

Ken was a faithful member of St. Joseph's Catholic Church, now currently All

Saints Parish of Berlin, where he is a Holy Name Society Member. He is also a member of the Wells-Krause V.F.W. Post 2925 of Berlin.
