Shirley Ann (Kryszak) Frost age 72, of Berlin, passed away Saturday March 28, 2020 with her family by her side.

Shirley was born on November 28, 1947 to the late Carl and Isabelle (Nowak) Kryszak in Sheboygan Wisconsin. Shirley graduated North High School in 1965 where she was proud to be a member of the National Honor Society. Shirley graduated St. Mary's School of Nursing in Milwaukee in 1968.
